## If your child is in Shanghai and will attend school daily, here are some key points:

- Every student will have a qualified and experienced homeroom teacher who will provide face-to-face instruction.
- Students will receive face-to-face instruction in all subjects: math, reading, writing, science, social studies, Mandarin, P.E., music, art, and RSB.
- ▶ The school day begins at 8:00 a.m. and ends at 3:20 p.m.
- The ES program runs on a 6-day schedule. Students rotate through Specials (P.E., music, art).
- Students will have Mandarin daily. Students in Grade 1 and Grade 2 will have a daily 30-minute class and students in Grade 3 and Grade 4 will have a daily 40-minute class provided by Concordia's highly qualified, experienced Mandarin Specialists.
- The ELL and LS programs will offer modified support for students at the beginning of the academic year.
- Teachers will use Seesaw allowing students to demonstrate their learning. Parents will have access to view their child's work.
- Students in Shanghai will have access to both print and electronic library resources. The physical library will remain closed at the beginning of the year. Library personnel will visit individual classrooms periodically so that students may access the print materials.

# If your child will participate in Distance Learning (DL) in the ES Division, here are some key points:

- Every student will have a qualified and experienced homeroom teacher who will provide DL instruction.
- Seesaw Class will be the primary Learning Management System (LMS) for the ES Division. Students will access learning materials each day on this platform. In addition, students will post their work for the teacher to review. Student work is only visible to the teacher and the parents.
- Seesaw Activities will be posted by 8:00 a.m. each day.
- Depending on your family's location, some students will be placed in a North America cohort or an Asia cohort. If your child is the United States or in Canada, then your child's Seesaw Activities will be posted by 8:00 a.m. Pacific Standard Time (PST). If your child is in Asia, then your child's Seesaw Activities will be posted by 8:00 a.m. (Beijing Time).
- Students will receive instruction in all subjects: math, reading, writing, science, social studies, Mandarin, P.E., music, art, and RSB.
- The DL program will be a blend of synchronous and asynchronous teaching.
  - The DL teacher will provide synchronous teaching via Zoom. These live sessions will provide opportunities for the students to interact with their teacher.
  - ▷ Each class will last 40-45 minutes with a 15-20 minute break between classes.
  - ▷ The ELL and LS programs will offer modified support for students through scheduled Zoom sessions.
- DL teachers will typically provide feedback to students daily in at least one subject.
- DL students will continue to have access to all of the electronic library resources.
